
In the Spotlight: Spackly Stories for a Starry, Starry Night! \star \star \star

Hest, Amy. <u>On the Night of the Shooting Star.</u> (Solitary neighbors become friends when they both see a falling star.)

Hyde, Catherine. <u>The Star Tree.</u> (On a Midsummer night, Mia travels with many different animals all the way to the great Star Tree where she gets a star to replace her nightlight.)

Jeffers, Oliver. How to Catch a Star. (A little boy who loves stars, tries creative ways to get a star of his own.)

Lieshout, Elle van. <u>The Wish.</u> (A hungry woman survives the winter when she makes a wish on a falling star.)

Lobel, Gillian. <u>Little Bear's Special Wish.</u> (Little Bear wants a very special gift, a star, for his mother's birthday. Will he be able to catch one?)

Matheson, Christie. <u>Touch the Brightest Star.</u> (Readers follow the directions on each page to make wonderful things appear, from constellations to shooting stars.)
